2015 ELIZABETH HURLOCK BECKMAN AWARD

- The Beckman Award was created to benefit teachers who have inspired their former students to make a significant contribution to society. The award is given to current or former academic faculty members who have inspired their former students to "create an organization which has demonstrably conferred a benefit on the community at large." Alternatively, the academic faculty member must have inspired their former students to "establish on a lasting basis a concept, procedure, or movement of comparable benefit to the community at large."
- The award is given for individuals in the disciplines/professions of psychology, law, and medicine. The list of past recipients includes a number of psychologists, which is not surprising given that Dr. Beckman herself was a pioneer in psychology, as well as an educator and renowned author. → The Teaching of Psychology Idea Exchange (ToPIX) features updates to a number of regular sections since December 2014. These include a potpourri of new clips and videos to the Therapy Video, Research Methods Video, Developmental Video, and Social Video pages. ToPIX Video pages alert instructors to relevant YouTube videos that can be easily inserted into presentation slides, course management shells, or webpages. Similarly, contributors have provided updates to the Stats in the News, I/O in the News, and Cognitive Psychology in the News pages in the last month. ToPIX "In the News" pages tend to be a collection of newspaper and magazine

headlines or online columns that relate to psychological phenomena. Often, but not always, these articles will have links to pertinent empirical research. An online segregation simulation based on Nobel Prize winning research was added to the "Social in the Classroom" page. This is just one example of the types of activities and demonstrations that can be found on the ToPIX "In the Classroom" pages.

- Quite a few new sections and ToPIX pages have been created over the past few months. SOTL WORKSHOP APPLICATIONS NOW OPEN

- → The Society for the Teaching of Psychology announces the fifth STP SoTL Workshop. SoTL is defined as methodologically rigorous scholarly work conducted to enhance teaching and advance learning, ideally resulting in peer-reviewed products made public. We invite applications from faculty who would like to learn more about the process of developing and/or writing a scholarship of teaching and learning (SoTL) project.
- The workshop will allow small groups of faculty members to receive guidance on SoTL research from an experienced mentor and consult with both statistical and publication experts. Each participant will be placed with a mentor and a team of 3-4 peers. The mentor will support participants through the research process, which may include discussing ideas or analyzing, outlining, and writing a final product. The ultimate goal is to generate a complete manuscript.
- This workshop will be held at the same time and place as the STP Annual Teaching Conference (ACT) in October 2015, in Atlanta, GA. The cost of the SoTL workshop is \$150 and includes all meals AND all three keynote sessions of the concurrent ACT Conference. Mentors will work with their teams starting June 1st (by email/phone) to prepare for the workshop as well as Friday morning and Saturday afternoon of the workshop. 

REVISED CAREER-EXPLORATION RESOURCE AT OTRP

→ Ruth Ault, Director of OTRP, is pleased to announce a major revision of Drew Appleby's "Online Career-Exploration Resource for Psychology Majors." The resource now has two parts. The first, for faculty, contains cited references, suggestions of ways to use the resource to promote student success, and lists of printed and online sources to aid them in their career-advising activities. The second resource, for students, consists of a list of 262 careers (organized into 15 broad occupational categories) that psychology majors can prepare to enter. Persons employed in 60 of these careers are psychologists who must hold the appropriate graduate degree. In the remaining 202 psychology-related careers, 120 can be entered with a bachelor's degree and 112 require a graduate degree. Following each career name are hotlinks for websites, videos, interviews, and e-book chapters containing information that provides students with online career-exploration resources. Faculty, advisors, and administrators can also use this material in their classes, advising sessions, and departmental websites to help psychology majors begin the process of accomplishing Goal 5: Professional Development of APA's Guidelines for the Undergraduate Psychology Major: Version 2.0. 

RENEWING STP AS AN APA MEMBER OF DIVISION 2

STP members who are also members of APA should check their APA dues statements for an itemized assessment fee for Division 2. If your Division 2 renewal appears on your APA dues statement, do not pay online at the STP Web site. You may end up paying twice for your membership. However, if you are a member of STP, and the Division 2 renewal does not appear on your APA dues statement, please contact the APA Member Services Office at divi-sion@apa.org so that we may correct this error.

APS MEMBERS, PLEASE NOTE

APS members who choose the \$25 STP option on the APS renewal form will receive full membership in STP and will have access to all member benefits. You may activate membership through your APS check off OR through the STP webpage at http://teachpsych.org/members/registration/index.php. However, please be sure not to pay through BOTH alternatives. If you hold membership in both APS and APA, we will ask APA to include the membership in your APA membership profile, and you will receive renewal notices from APA. Please do not pay twice by using the APS option again.

APS Members who belong to APA and have joined STP (Division 2) through their APA membership will receive automatic, itemized STP renewal notices in their annual APA dues statements. Please renew STP in this manner and do not select the APS check off. You may pay twice.

In addition, our arrangement with APS requires a \$25 fee for all membership categories. Students and retired members who are eligible for a \$15 membership fee may wish to join or renew membership through the STP Web options.
